Due to the newly released government closure mandates that were issued today by Governor Dewine concerning the Covid-19 Virus, the Miami County YMCA will temporarily close at 11:00 p.m. on Monday, March 16th. The YMCA will reopen as soon as the Governor lifts his mandate. For now, the mandates do not include the Childcare Program offered at the Piqua Branch YMCA, but that could change quickly and we encourage parents to develop a back-up plan for care as soon as possible.

Today, like every month for the last 25 years, our monthly membership drafts were processed. It is our plan to make adjustments to the April draft. Please be patient with us, but once your request has been reviewed and completed, you will receive an email confirmation. Please retain that confirmation for your records. We will also be contacting our corporate partners concerning members who pay for their membership through a payroll deduction. In addition, we will do what we can to extend expiration dates for members who pay their memberships in full annually.

A cohort of YMCAs collaborated to create an on-demand healthy living network called YMCA 360, which includes programs that can be accessed from anywhere. In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, the team behind YMCA 360 has made this programming temporarily available for FREE for all of you.
